



Sermon: Trait #1- Fighting and Quarreling
Day 1

Read 1 Corinthians 1:10-13;

What was Paul addressing here?

Read Ephesians 2:19-22, Romans 12:4-10;

From these passages, why would you say it is important not to quarrel ?

Are we not the body of Christ and members one of another? What does that mean?

Quarreling causes confusion, What does James 3:13-18 teach us about fights.

As brothers and sisters in Christ we are called to be of one mind (In agreement with each other in faith, doctrine, love and the application of these! We as a Christian family represent the love of Christ to the world!

So whether its arguing over our favorite teacher as in 1 Cor. 1:10-13; or over something else, we can't give place to the devil to divide us. We learned Satan's tactics in the Spiritual Warfare series. Now we stand without excuse, so lets be sober and vigilant! Why? Cause we know satan is out to divide (God's people) steal (our blessings in Christ), kill (you), and destroy (your testimony)!



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Day 2

Yesterday we saw some scriptures showing how we are one body, lets look at some more:

Read Matthew 18:19-20;

Here we see if 2 or more are gathered together in His name, He is there in the midst of us!
What do you think this verse means?

How would Jesus being physically in front of us change the way we talk to and about each other?

Read 1 Peter 2:4-10;

What do you think it means to be built up into a Spiritual house?

How is this like being the Body of Christ?

Read Ephesians 4:1-7

What are these verses adding to the above discussions?



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Day 3

Read James 4:1-10

What do these verses tell us is the source of many of our arguments and fights?

What does he mean by “passions” when he says, “because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions.”?

Where do you see an example of this in your life? Whether you are in the fight or are observing an argument from a distance.

How does submitting to God help in our disagreements and fights?

Look carefully at verse 10. What do you think this verse means?



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Day 4

Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-26

How does the church function as a body?

How do you see this at Keystone Church?

What happens to this image when conflict arises?

Have you ever been a part of a church conflict? If so, think back over your experience and relate how these verses could have changed that ordeal.

How can you better be a part of the “body” of the church?



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Day 5

Read 1 Corinthians 1

What seemed to be the problems in the church at Corinth according to this chapter?

How did Paul feel about it?

How did it reflect badly for the church?

Go through the 3 questions to ask ourselves as presented in the sermon. What is there that is happening at Keystone Church that you have conflict with or about and how can each of these apply to that situation?

Here are the questions:

What does the bible say about this issue?

Is my side an opinion or is it doctrine?

How can I best show the love of Christ through this conflict?
